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## Academic Opportunities

### General Information

To address the needs of all learners at Windsor High School, administrators and faculty have come together to develop programs and courses to challenge those students wishing to enhance their learning. Information on the programs/courses offered at Windsor High School are briefly summarized to assist with the selection of classes during the student's four years at WHS.

### Aims Career Academy

Aims Career Academy is a partnership between WHS and Aims Career and Technical Education Office. The program provides training in the areas of: Automobile Collision Repair, Automotive Service Technology, Oil and Gas Technologies, Med Prep, Graphics Design and Communication Media. There are a limited number of seats available each year. Students establish an official college transcript that builds toward a career or technical certificate.

### Aims Career Pathways

Aims Career Pathways are classes that are taken on the Windsor High School campus. These courses are taught by adjunct professors from Aims Community College. The programs that are currently offered are: Criminal Justice, Emergency Medical Services, and Fire Science Technology. Selection for seats are limited and may be determined by an application process. Students have the opportunity to earn certificates and will obtain an official college transcript upon completion of coursework.

### Colorado Online Learning (COL)

COL collaborates with WHS to provide high-quality, standards-based supplemental online coursework for schools and students needing advanced courses, curriculum enhancement and/or to resolve scheduling conflicts. COL provides a wide variety of courses.

### Dual Credit Program with the University of Northern Colorado

- Students have the opportunity to earn college credit while still in high school at a significantly reduced cost.
- The dual courses with UNC are taught by UNC approved faculty to teach advanced courses at WHS.
- After earning a grade of "C" or better, students can pay for credit from UNC that may be transferred to other colleges/universities; however, a grade of "D" or lower will still be reflected on the UNC and WHS transcripts.

### Advanced Placement (AP)

- AP courses give students an additional opportunity to earn college credit based on a final test score (Tests are taken in the spring and require a fee of \$91 plus a registration fee.)
- Students are taught to analyze, reason and understand the world from their own perspective.
- Course requirements and expectations are challenging and ensure student's commitment both in and outside the classroom.

### Advanced Diploma

- The Advanced Diploma is a college preparatory program that meets suggested college coursework requirements. The coursework necessary to receive an Advanced Diploma is specified in the WHS course description handbook.

### Concurrent Enrollment

- Concurrent Enrollment is a program that allows students to simultaneously enroll in high school and a college or university. A benefit of Concurrent Enrollment is that high school students may experience classes taught on a college campus at a minimal cost.
- Students must be in good credit standing and complete courses that are not offered at WHS, or must have exhausted the curriculum in a particular content area. Course must also be in line with the student's Individual Career and Academic Plan.
- Courses taken through Concurrent Enrollment must be at least 3 college credits to transfer a minimum of .5 credit back to WHS.
- Grades earned through Concurrent Enrollment are computed into the student's WHS cumulative GPA and may be weighted. They will also receive college credit that may be transferable to other colleges and universities.
